Craft projects and because many of these schools are poorly equipped, we donate classroom supplies and sports equipment.


2021 CENSUS OF LADAKH



According to the latest information, the population of Ladakh breaks down to 37,469,335 Rural (61.33%) and 23,625,962 Urban (38.67%) in an area slightly smaller than Portugal.



Literacy rates are 68.73% in the Rural areas while much higher in Urban with 85.78%. The statistic show that Muslims form the most popular religion followed by Buddhist then Christian, Hindu, Sikhism and Jain following at much smaller percentages.



Nearly all activity is agricultural, with the exception of the large number of monasteries and the major regional trading towns of Leh and Kargil. The farming of barley and wheat is tightly constrained to the summer months between May and September.



Pastoral herding of yak, sheep and goats suits both nomadic and settled communities while the latter also cultivate the barley, wheat and peas and increasingly horticulture (apricots and apples).



Agriculture also determines the social movements, as in winter the entire household might move up to the pastureland of tending large herds. School age children and the elderly usually remain in the village year-round.
